Project 2 – The 20th Century Scarlet Letter – Crime and Punishment – For this project we will examine the idea of public humiliation as a punishment for offenses of less than a capital nature. This project will be done in four parts and should be compiled in a manner that will make the distinct parts distinguishable from each other. Remember turn in a hunk of junk and I will refuse to grade it.

In Texas, justices are dishing up a peculiar brand of punishment these days in guise of public humiliation verses jail time. This is drawn upon the fact that Texas has no set penalties outlined for offenses except capital ones, which leaves punishment up to the judge, and as Judge Poe put it the belief that peer pressure can do far more to rehabilitate a criminal than prison. It is because of this belief Judge Poe practices doling out public humiliation Puritan style in his 20th century courtroom.
